Bairnsdale - Your ideal base for exploring the vast Gippsland Lakes, Mitchell River and the surrounding forests, Bairnsdale is a laid-back country town close to scenic drives.

Briagolong - At the foothills of the Victorian Alps sits this is a great place to base and explore the high country. The town is perhaps best known for the tranquil Blue Pool, a large natural pool in a gorge.

Dargo - Surrounded by forested hills, boulder-studded mountains and see-it-to-believe-it views, Dargo is a base for innumerable high country adventures by foot, horse, raft or 4x4.

Foster - The town is just 30 minutes from Wilsons Promontory National Park and a short drive from other popular destinations including Shallow Inlet, Corner Inlet, Sandy Point and Waratah Bay.

Golden Beach - Golden Beach features pristine golden sands bordered by dunes and coastal vegetation. With parks, BBQ's and even an RV stop. Enjoy the quiet and serene beauty of the 90 Mile Beach.

Heyfield - Sitting on the banks of the Thomson River, Heyfield is a must stop town, with quality cafes, bakeries and restaurants along with some amazing walks as you head into the high country.

Lake Glenmaggie - a boaters paradise, Lake Glenmaggie is a mecca for all things water sports. Whether you want to just dip a toe in or take out the boat, Lake Glenmaggie is the place for you.

Lake Wellington - forming part of the Gippsland Lakes, Lake Wellington is a perfect spot to enjoy a lazy day of fishing in the sun, or heading through calm waters on your boat.

Lakes Entrance - Set on the edge of Ninety Mile Beach, where the Gippsland Lakes, Australia's largest inland waterways, break through to the Southern Ocean.

Licola - Licola is a remote alpine town, and gateway to world-class national parks and outdoor adventure. You can refuel and stock up on groceries and maps for your adventure out in the Alpine National Park.

Loch Sport - Loch Sport is located on the southern shores of Lake Victoria, the eastern side of the Gippsland Lakes. It also has direct access to the Ninety Mile Beach and is surrounded by National and Coastal Parkland.

Maffra - With world class wineries, cafes and restaurants to sample. Along with some amazing attractions to visit as well, Maffra is sure to impress.

Mt Hotham - in the heart of the Victorian Alps where breathtaking views of the surrounding alpine peaks stretch for miles. In winter ski and snowboard, and in summer enjoy mountain biking or hiking.

Omeo - This pioneering mountain town is renowned for its gold mining history, high country cattle grazing and historic buildings.



Paynesville - a charming village surrounded by lakes on three sides, with canals and inlets providing plentiful sheltered moorings for boats.

Phillip Island - Idyllic beaches, captivating coastlines, family fun activities and world-class events. See little penguins and sleepy koalas in their natural habitat, teach the kids to swim on a quiet bay beach, and soak up all the action at the Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix..

Port Albert - with a deep history in fishing, whaling and much more, Port Albert is now a fisherman's paradise. Enjoy fresh caught fish from one of Victoria's finest fish and chip shops right on the wharf.

Rosedale - Rosedale has a quirky metro feel, but still a quaint country charm. With bakeries, cafes and many more eateries to explore, along with a town walk and even a life sized horse statue.

Seaspray - Set along the shores of the iconic Ninety Mile Beach, lies the sleepy town of Seaspray. With the shimmering waters of Lake Reeve over yonder, the town attracts beaching, fishing, boating types.

Stratford - Set on the lush Avon River, Stratford is a tranquil town with an artsy vibe. The gently flowing river and persistent bird song provides a scenic backdrop for swimming, fishing and canoeing.

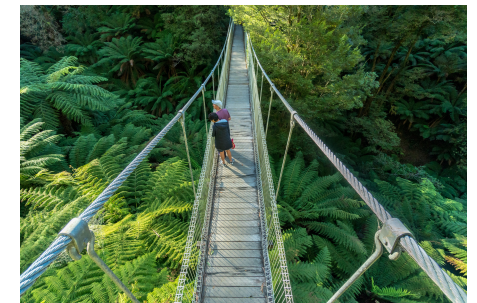

Wilson's Promontory - Be awed by Victoria's largest coastal wilderness area in Wilsons Promontory National Park. This 50,000 hectare reserve is threaded with a labyrinth of walking tracks that showcase all manner of magical realms sheltering abundant wildlife.

Woodside Beach - Woodside Beach is the ideal location for a peaceful yet brooding long walk. Take the short trail to the beach and brace yourself as Woodside Beach stretches forever in both directions.

Yarram - Locked between the Tarra Bulga National Park, Wilsons Promontory and the Ninety Mile Beach, Yarram is surrounded by Gippsland's wild beauty.
