

BOATING IN THE MIDDLE OF EVERYWHERE



The Middle of Everywhere has some great opportunities for you to launch your boat and enjoy a leisurely cruise. With inland ports, beach access and much more to explore.

Beach Ramps -

Manns Beach - Small access ramp to beach. Over beach launching only.

McLoughlin's Beach - Two lane ramp with alongside boarding jetty (one side only).

Merriman's Creek - Boat ramp access

Delray Beach - Boat ramp at Delray Beach

Lake Access -

Lake Victoria (Loch Sport) - Three boat ramps adjacent to Charlie Street. Two ramps for small craft and jet-skis, in Seagull Drive & The Boulevard.

Lake Glenmaggie - Boat ramps at Kelly Cove, Lake Glenmaggie Caravan Park, Stuckeys Point, Glenmaggie and District Boat Club, Sandy Point. Some restrictions apply in certain areas of the lake.

Lake Wellington - Marlay Point Boat ramp and jetty.

KAYAKING/CANOEING IN THE MIDDLE OF EVERYWHERE



Port Albert - with the gentle waters around Port Albert, it is perfect for a paddle. Boats and kayaks can be hired from local business, Castim by the Jetty.

Lake Glenmaggie - great variety of spaces around the lake to enjoy a quiet paddle.

Cowwarr Weir - popular for kayaking, fishing, swimming and picnicking. No powered boats are allowed on the weir. No camping or overnight stays are allowed.

Avon River (Stratford) - The gently flowing river and persistent bird song provides a scenic backdrop for swimming, fishing and canoeing.

Lake Wellington (Marlay Point) - the surrounds are bursting with wildlife and rich green scenery. Enter via Marlay Point boat ramp.

Lake Victoria (Loch Sport) - Gippsland Lakes is a popular destination for paddle boarding, with ample options for launch. Head to beach side areas to get up close and personal with the active local dolphin population.

Port of Sale - with the quiet waters of the Sale Canal, you'll find it a perfect spot to put in your kayak or canoe. Paddle all the out to the Gippsland Lakes or head just to the Swing Bridge and return for a shorter trip.



FISHING IN THE MIDDLE OF EVERYWHERE

Many towns throughout The Middle of Everywhere have dedicated Fishing/Angling Clubs that you can join. Or if you prefer a bit of quiet solitude, pull up and find your perfect spot.

Surf Fishing - The Middle of Everywhere has long been known as a great surf fisherman's haven. Spots like Port Albert, McLoughlin's Beach, Woodside, Seaspray, Golden Beach, Paradise Beach, Loch Sport, Reeve's Beach, Robertson's Beach and Mann's Beach are just a few top spots to try to wet your line. Some areas are known to be fantastic places to try and do a spot of shark fishing depending on time of year.

Lake Fishing - there's many great Lake fishing spots in The Middle of Everywhere. Why not try Cowwarr Weir, Loch Sport (Lake Victoria), Lake Glenmaggie, or Holland's Landing (Lake Wellington).

River Fishing - The Avon River at Stratford has areas of both large pools and sandy shallow banks for the kids. Cast in a line on the beautiful Macalister River, try to catch this upstream at Licola (home to some great fly fishing spots!) You can also whet your line in Sale (try your hand at the Sale Canal, or by the banks of the Swing Bridge), or even in the middle at Heyfield (the Heyfield Wetlands are a beaut spot to spend a lazy day fishing).

Lake Glenmaggie - Lake Glenmaggie has become a mecca for all things watersports. With many ramps to put vessels in at, and calm waters to enjoy.

Hollands Landing - Lake Wellington and access to McLennan Straits is the perfect spot for the jetski. With passage across the lake well defined, as is the entrance to the Latrobe River.

Loch Sport - On Lake Victoria you'll find some great places to get out on the jet ski and enjoy the open waters.

Seaspray - Golden Beach - The numerous rips and longshore bar produce literally hundreds of potential beach breaks, particularly on the outer bar. Conditions vary considerably and are best with a low to moderate south swell and north to north-west winds. With smaller breaks, it is ideal for beginners.
