

**Briagolong -** At the foothills of the Victorian Alps sits this is a great place to explore the high country. Perhaps best known for the tranquil Blue Pool, a large natural pool in a gorge.

**Dargo -** Surrounded by forested hills and see-it-to-believe-it views, Dargo is a base for innumerable high country adventures by foot, horse, raft or 4x4.

**Loch Sport -** Loch Sport is located on the southern shores of Lake Victoria, the eastern side of the Gippsland Lakes. It also has direct access to the Ninety Mile Beach and is surrounded by National and Coastal Parkland.

**Licola -** Licola is a remote alpine town, and gateway to national parks and outdoor adventure. Refuel and stock up on groceries and maps for your adventure out in the Alpine National Park.

**Walhalla -** Once a gold mining town, Walhalla features a Long Tunnel Mine and Railway.

**Tarra Valley -** Home to majestic forests and deep fern gullies, you can easily find yourself lost in the magic of nature at Tarra Valley National Park.

**Lakes Entrance -** Boasting Australia's largest inland network of waterways. Lakes Entrance is on the edge of Ninety Mile Beach where the Gippsland Lakes meets the Southern Ocean.

**Bairnsdale -** Your ideal base for exploring the vast Gippsland Lakes, Mitchell River and the surrounding forests, Bairnsdale is a laid-back country town close to scenic drives.

**Foster -** Just 30 minutes from Wilsons Promontory National Park and a short drive from Shallow Inlet, Corner Inlet, Sandy Point and Waratah Bay.











**Port Albert** - with a deep history in fishing, whaling and much more, it is now a fisherman's paradise. Enjoy fresh caught fish from one of finest fish and chip shops right on the wharf.

**Rosedale -** Rosedale has a quirky metro feel, with country charm. With bakeries, cafes and many more eateries to explore, along with a town walk and even a life sized horse statue.

**Seaspray -** Set along the shores of the iconic Ninety Mile Beach, lies Seaspray. With the shimmering waters of Lake Reeve over yonder, the town attracts beaching, fishing, boating types.

**Stratford** - Set on the lush Avon River, Stratford is a town with an artsy vibe. The gently flowing river and persistent bird song provides a scenic backdrop for swimming, fishing and canoeing.

**Traralgon** - Amble along the wide tree-lined streets, beautiful gardens and spacious parklands of Gippsland's largest city.

**Sale** - filled with arts, culture and some beautiful natural attractions, Sale is at the heart of Central Gippsland.

**Maffra** - with a focus on nature, Maffra features beautiful tree lined streets, wetlands and an amazing vehicle museum.

**Phillip Island -** Home to the Little Penguins, idyllic beaches, captivating coastlines, unique wildlife, family fun activities and world-class events, adventure awaits you on Phillip Island.

**Wilson's Prom** - Discover secluded beaches and coastal forests set against the backdrop of the park's granite mountains. Look out for native birds as well as other wildlife.
