

16- CRITERION HOTEL

99 Macalister Street

In 1865, tenders were taken to build a large hotel in Sale, which saw the Criterion Hotel take shape. Additions have included the veranda in 1878 and more recently the Hotel has undergone a major rejuvenation turning the building into a boutique restaurant and accommodation venue.



17- SALE HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM

130 Foster Street

Believed to be the oldest municipal building in Gippsland, the original section was the first council chambers built in 1864 when the Borough of Sale was established. Council vacated the property in 1960 and it then became home to the Historical Society.



18- COLONIAL CLUB HOTEL (FORMER)

101-105 Foster Street

Built in 1858 by Richard Bennison, the Club Hotel was a hub for squatters. A visit by the Prince of Wales is commemorated by a plaque in the hotel. A serious fire in the late 1900s the hotel was later restored in the 1980s.



19- SALE MONUMENTS

York & Foster Streets and McIntosh Drive

Monuments dedicated to settlers and explorers of Sale and Gippsland can be found throughout the town.



20- OUR LADY OF SION

341-369 York Street

The first sisters of Our Lady of Sion arrived in Australia in 1890. The sisters moved into their newly built convent and Notre Dame de Sion School in December 1893. Now developed as Our Lady of Sion Catholic Primary School due to open in 2027.

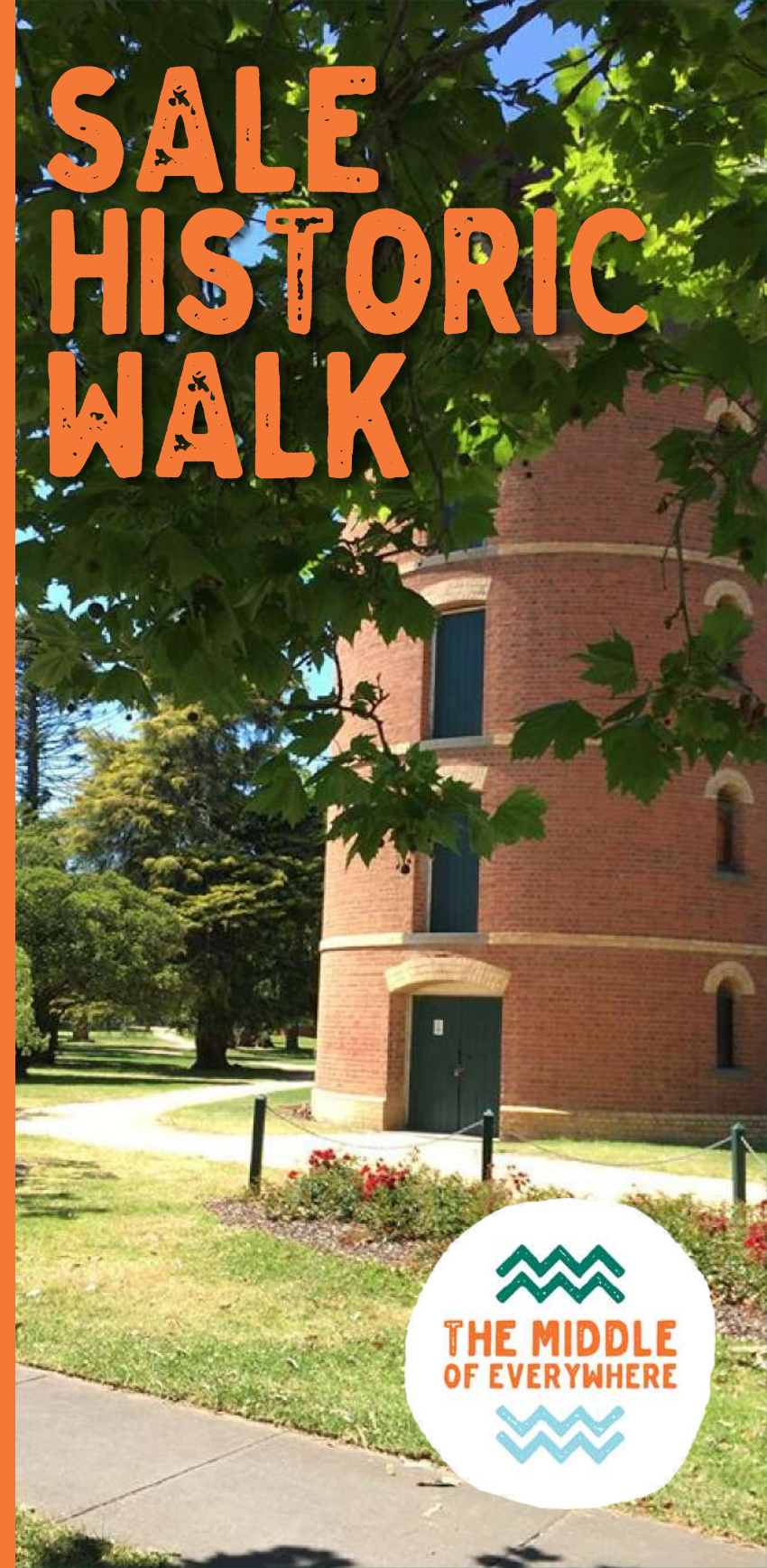
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SALE HISTORIC WALK



1- PORT OF SALE

Grand Canal Drive, Sale

The Port of Sale and man-made Sale Canal, was completed in 1890, linked the town to the Gippsland Lakes system, allowing access by boat to the Bass Strait.



2- PORT OF SALE PRECINCT

70 - 100 Foster Street, Sale

Consisting of The Wedge Entertainment Centre, The Wellington Centre and surrounding outdoor areas, the Port of Sale precinct offers many spaces to enjoy.



3- ST MARY'S CATHEDRAL

47 - 57 Foster Street

The present church was built on the site of an earlier chapel. Work commenced on the church in 1886 by local builder George Wynd. In 1887, Sale became a diocese with James Corbett the founding Bishop.



4- ST PATRICKS COLLEGE

29 - 41 Pearson Street

St Patricks College was constructed in 1921 and originally opened by the Marist Brothers and later amalgamated with the nearby Our Lady of Sion in 1977.



5- SALE SIGNAL BOX

Railway Pl

The Signal Box on Reeve Street was erected in 1888 and has seen little change since it was first built. The signal box was originally the end of the line.



6- SALE COURTHOUSE

79-87 Foster Street

A County Court was appointed at Sale in 1858. Sale was added to the Supreme Court circuit in 1866. The Sale Courthouse was built in 1863 and received extensions in 1874, 1889 and 1920.



7- SULLIVAN BRAHAM (FORMER)

104 Raymond Street

This imposing headquarters was built by the Bank of Australasia in 1875, the scale is reflecting the banks confidence in Sale as a region.



8- AMP BUILDING (FORMER)

118-124 Raymond Street

Erected in 1930 to replace an earlier 1919 building. The Australian Mutual Provident building was described as the 'most notable addition to the architecture of the town'.



9- ALLMAN MORONEY (FORMER)

121 Raymond Street

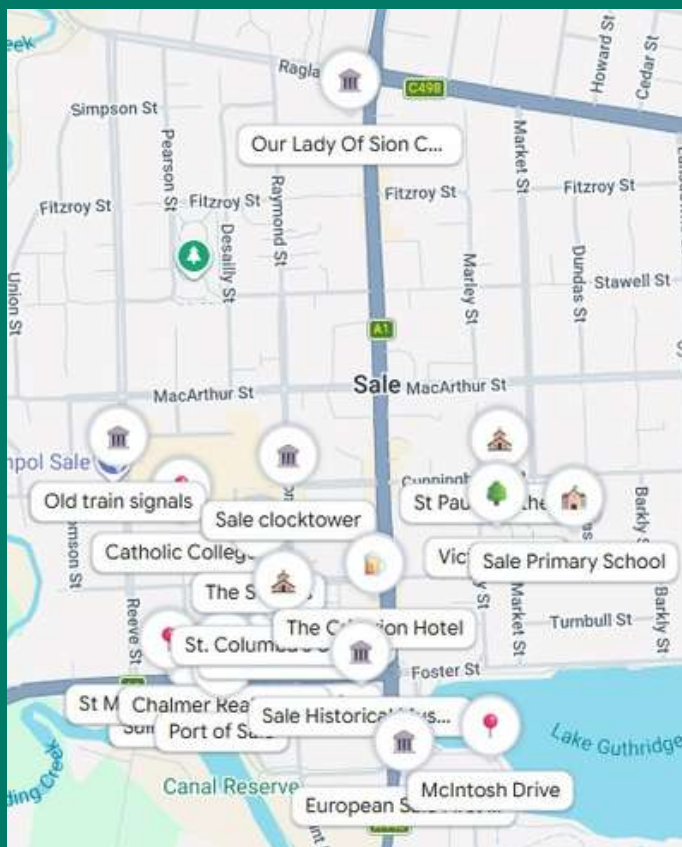
This impressive building was originally the Commonwealth Bank, built in 1889 and is a further demonstration to the economic strength of Sale by the late 1880s.



10- COBB & CO STABLES (FORMER)

199 Raymond Street

The Stables, a large timber building was originally built in 1878, that same year they were occupied by Robertson, Wagner & Co, who traded as Cobb & Co Stables.



This Sale Historical Walk is a leisurely hour and a half walk throughout the historical buildings, and environmental heritage of the Sale township.

11- SALE CLOCKTOWER

Pedestrian Mall

The original clocktower was built in 1884 as an addition to the post office and demolished in 1964. In 1988, the current tower was built as a community project.



12- METHODIST SCHOOL (FORMER)

103 Cunninghame Street

Built for the Methodist Church in Sale and Surrounds in 1965, this former Methodist Sunday School has been converted into a bakery, known locally as the Centre Bakery.



13- ST PAUL'S CATHEDRAL

149 Cunninghame Street

St Paul's Cathedral was built by a local builder in 1883-84 to replace the first St Paul's. It became a cathedral following the creation of the Anglican Diocese in 1902 with Dr A.W. Pain as Bishop.



14- VICTORIA PARK

Cnr Marley & Cunninghame Streets

A large brick water tower (now a museum) was constructed in 1887 and a smaller concrete tower in 1922. The bandstand was built in 1913 to celebrate the Jubilee of Sale. It was dismantled in 1976 and reconstructed in 1980-83.



15- SALE PRIMARY SCHOOL

123-135 Macalister Street

Sale State School was built in 1882-83 to replace the Common School in Raymond Street, part of which still remains. The school reflects Venetian Gothic influences with its wall patterns and window arches.
